Dr. Kiehle was a man richly endowed—with ability far superior to that of the average person; with a lovable disposition which led him to overlook faults in others; with a genial humor which made him a favorite with all he came to know; with vision which placed upon his shoulders leadership in many movements. He did a great work during his sixty years of service in Minnesota.

The Northwest School is honored in having his name inscribed upon one of its principal buildings—The Kiehle Building, constructed in 1910 and formally dedicated in 1911.
