



Inter-Society Debate

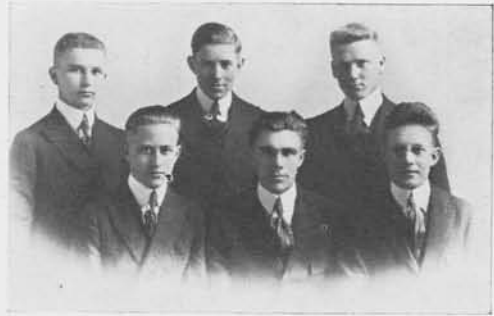
