

# Northwest School Requests And Trust Funds

**Class of 1917 Trust Fund**—The Class of 1917 has provided \$140 to be used as a students' loan fund. The income is to be awarded annually to the student who makes the greatest progress in debating and public speaking. Awarded in 1919 to Olga R. Spjut. No award was made in 1920. In 1921 two awards were made. The public speaking prize was awarded to Clifford Lee, Hendrum, and the debating prize was awarded to John Mansfield, of Roosevelt.

**Class of 1919 Presents Service Flag Case**—The Class of 1919 has provided a beautiful and substantial leaded glass case for the Northwest School Service Flag.

**Class of 1920 Fund**—A committee of the Class of 1920 has been appointed to recommend the disposition to be made of the fund left by that class.

**Fairfax-Andover Social Club Loan Fund**—This fund has been increased to \$150. It is provided by a group of farm men and women living in two townships near Crookston. This fund is used as a students' loan fund.
