The past year there were 3437 enrolled in the Northwestern Minnesota District with enrollments distributed by projects as follows: Bread Baking 438; Garment Making 287; Cake Making 37; Dairy Calf 465; Baby Beef 110; Sheep 257; Pig 252; Poultry 587; Potato 390; Canning 277; Garden 110; Health 115. Out of this number 2565 completed their projects, exhibited at some local county, district, or state fair and turned in their records and reports.

The Club Motto is "To Make the Best Better." They are going to live up to this motto and make even a better record in 1925.

Myrtle Himrum of Lake Park, Becker County has made an enviable record as a Dairy Calf Club member. Her pure bred holstein, Woodville Bess, was Grand Champion
