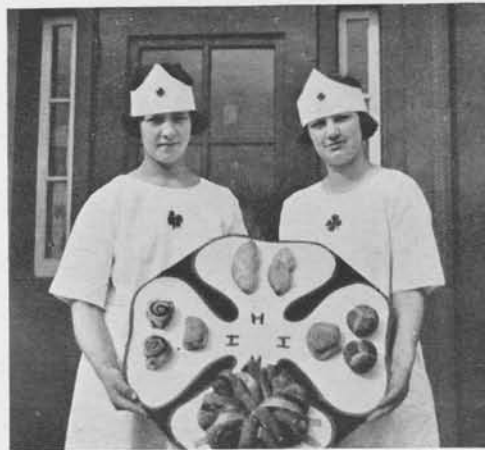

Harry Lewis '26, Warroad, who completed alfalfa and potato projects was awarded the sweepstakes ribbon for best exhibits of potatoes over all the exhibits at the Red River Valley Winter Shows. Other home project students who were winners at this show are: Lawrence Majer, Strathcona; Wallace Miller, Roseau; and Walter Luchau, Gary.

But the greatest values derived from home projects are not from the trophies and prizes won but from results obtained on the farm, in the home and in the community. Home projects have been significantly effective in teaching the application of important scientific principles to farm and home conditions; in demonstrating more efficient methods of production and management, and in introducing better crops, better livestock, better living conditions, and a better living to hundreds of Red River Valley farms.
