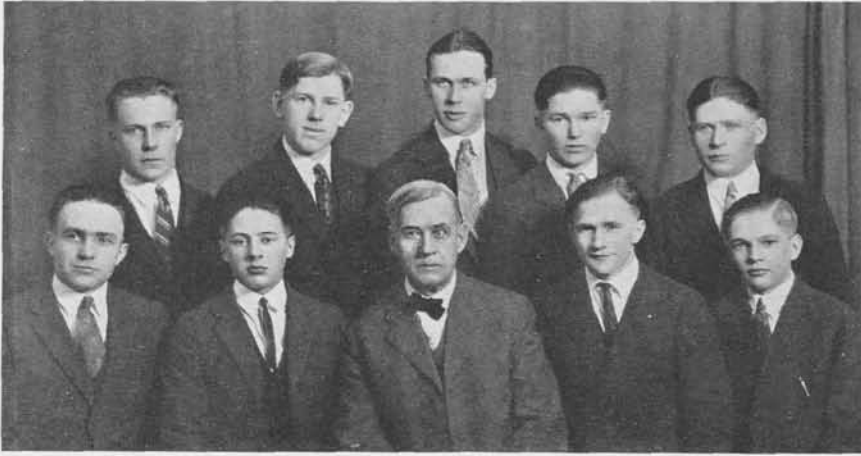

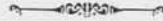
Top Row—E. MILLER, ANDERSON, SILNES, DAVIDS, HOWARD
