Stock Judging Contest

THE first inter-school stock judging contest was held Monday, February 9. This was the first day of the 1925 Red River Valley Winter Shows. The four schools that took part in the contest were Sub-collegiate school of Manitoba Agricultural College, Winnipeg; West Central School of Agriculture, Morris; County Agricultural School, Park River, North Dakota; and Northwest School of Agriculture. Those on the Northwest School team were Elmer Anderson, Phinney Stenborg, and Ray Magneson.

The Northwest School team won second place; Winnipeg, first; Park River, third; and Morris, fourth. Ray Magneson was high man in judging dairy cattle and Elmer Anderson had the high score for swine. Both Phinney Stenborg and Ray Magneson tied the score in sheep judging with one of the men on the Winnipeg team. The classes judged were beef, swine, dairy, and sheep. Sixty per cent was given on placing and forty on reasons. Out of a possible 1200 points the Northwest School secured 1010; the school at Winnipeg, 1062½ points. Elmer Anderson placed the sheep and swine right; Ray Magneson, dairy cattle and sheep; and Phinney Stenborg, the sheep. The total individual score for each member of the team was as follows: Elmer Anderson, 351; Phinney Stenborg, 293; and Ray Magneson, 366.

The inter-class stock judging contest was won by the Freshman Class. The Senior team had to take second place. Randolph Ostlie of the Freshman team won the medal for high man in swine judging; Jacob Sharpe and Harold Amundson, seniors, tied for the best judge of beef cattle; Lawrence Letness was best dairy judge; and Chester Johnson won first place as the best sheep and horse judge.
