FANNY B. LIPPITT, B.S., Matron, is a graduate of the University of Minnesota and Duluth Normal School. She joined the staff of the Northwest School in 1923. Miss Lippitt is head of the Home Economics department. As matron, she has immediate charge of the Dining Hall where about 250 students are fed three times a day. Her home management discussions with visiting farm women during the summer have been extremely popular. Previous to joining this faculty, she was instructor in the Home Economics department at Moorhead Teachers' College, summer session, and has had several years teaching experience in high school Home Economics.
