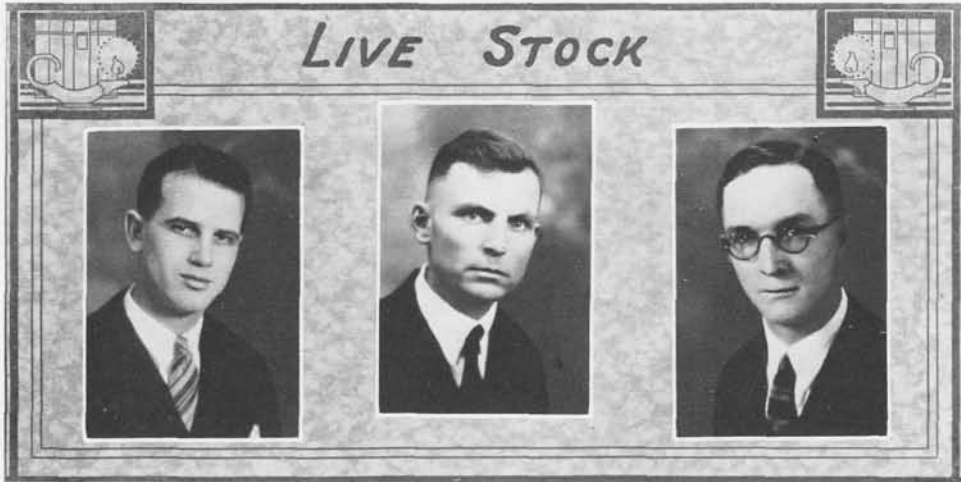


FACULTY



D. H. LA VOI, B.S.A., Athletic Coach, Preceptor, Assistant in Animal Husbandry and Livestock Extension specialist, is a graduate of the University of Minnesota, College of Agriculture.
