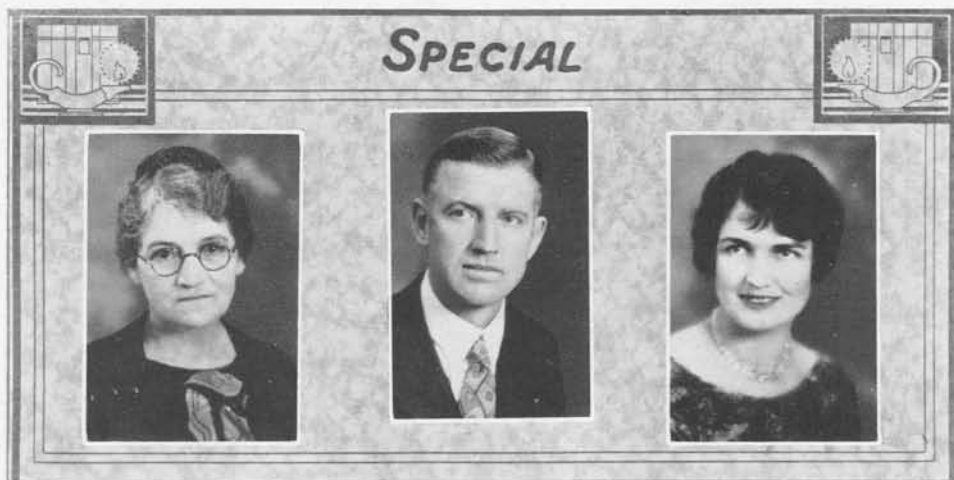


FACULTY
