EAST GRAND FORKS 13, AGGIES 13, AT CROOKSTON


On October 22 before a large Home-Coming crowd, the Aggies played a hard tie game with East Grand Forks high school.

Within a few minutes, he had made two long runs for two touchdowns, the first not counting. When the third quarter ended, the Aggies had five yards to go on the fourth down. A place-kick by Forseth scored three points in the fourth quarter making the score 13 to 6. The visitors made a successful pass, carried over for a touchdown and kicked goal, tying the game.
