FIVE literary societies, including three organizations for boys and two for girls, hold regular meetings every second Monday evening. The Pioneer, organized in 1910, is the oldest boys' society. The Lincoln was organized in 1915 and the Agrarian in 1919. The annual inter-society debate held this year on January 11 was won by the Pioneer society with Lincoln second and Agrarian third. Each society also enters two contestants in the annual oratorical contest.

The Home Economics club, organized for literary and social purposes has had a large active membership for many years. The Sanford Club, since its first meeting in October, 1920, has become important among school activities for girls. Each society is represented by two contestants in the annual declamatory contest held during Commencement week.

Each of the five societies elects officers, conducts its meetings, and outlines and prepares its own programs throughout the year.
