Caleb-Dorr Scholarships

EIGHT boys and girls from counties in the Red River Valley, who have made good records in 4-H club work, were awarded Caleb-Dorr scholarships last fall. Each scholarship consists of seventy-five dollars which is to help defray the expense for one year at the Northwest School of Agriculture, Crookston.

The purpose of the scholarship is to assist worthy boys and girls in acquiring an education in agriculture and home economics.

Alice Erickson of Pencer, Roseau county, has been in 4-H club work three years. During this time she has assumed the leadership of the club. She has taken part in the bread, cake, and sewing projects.

The scholarship in W. Ottertail county was awarded to Archie Overgaard of Dalton for consistent good work, two years with a baby beef and two more with pigs. With the scholarship and money made from his club pigs, Archie is putting himself through the first year of school at Crookston.

Four years ago, corn club work was started at Barnesville in Clay county. Loren Braton was among the first to join the club. His Minnesota 13 corn has taken the sweep-stake prize at the Winter Shows and first at the State Fair. In 1927 he selected sixty bushels of seed corn.

Freeman Allen of Thief River Falls has been in club work only one year but hopes to continue for several more years. His grade calf placed first at the county fair. He plans to buy a purebred this year.

Three State Fair trips and one National Dairy Show trip to Milwaukee is Orville Anderson's record in three years of club work. His dairy calf was the county champion one year. In judging, Orville was selected the first alternate on the state judging team.

Clarence Eidenschenck of Detroit Lakes won high honors with his fat barrow in his first year of club work. He is adding the sheep project for this year.

Harold Bendix of Henning has been a dairy calf club member three years. He was also a member of a demonstration team.

Arthur Widseth of Gonvick says that his six years in dairy calf club work have been happy and profitable years. His achievements in Clearwater county have been numerous, three firsts, two seconds, and one third.
