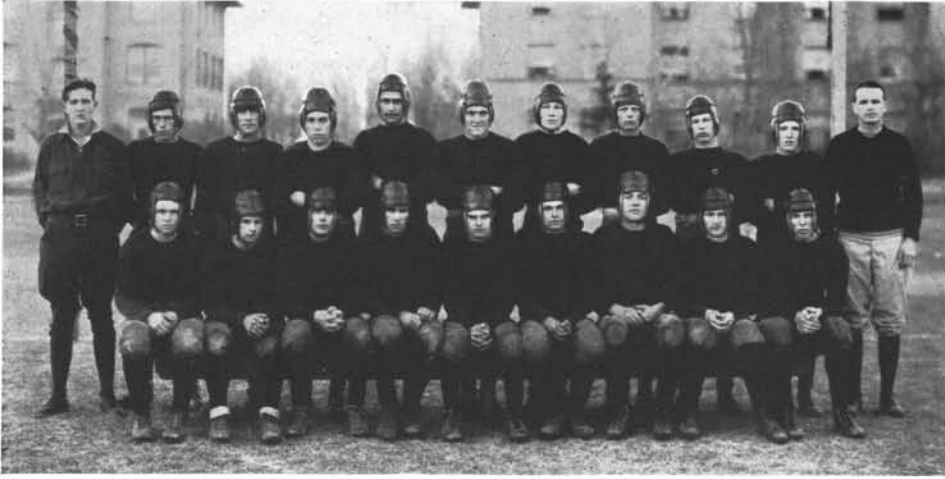


RED RIVER AGGIE

PROSPECTS for a winning football team were far from bright at the beginning of the 1928 season. Eleven lettermen graduated from the 1927 squad, necessitating the building of a practically new team. Besides their comparative greenness, the new men had facing them the hardest football schedule ever attempted by the Northwest School. Practice started with the first day of school under the able tutelage of Coach D. H. LaVoi. A squad of forty men reported for practice each day and labored hard to uphold the Aggie reputation on the gridiron. From the very start and until the curtain came down on the football season, the 1928 squad was characteristic of past Aggie teams. Always playing clean football, showing true sportsmanship, and always possessing the never-say-die spirit the team made a creditable showing considering the difficult schedule it faced. The season resulted in three victories and a like number of losses.

From the 1928 squad six regulars will be graduated and it is hoped that the rest will return to school next fall to help make the 1929 football season a success.
