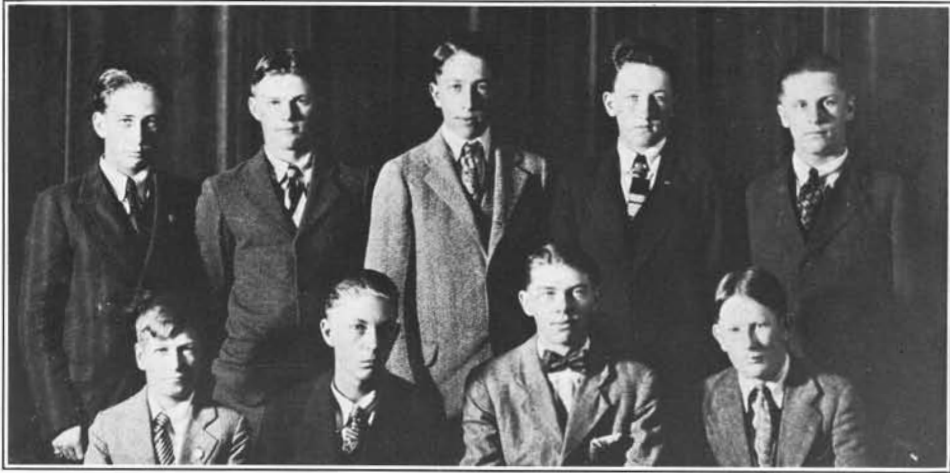


Boy Scouts
