

AGGIES, 34—RED LAKE FALLS, 7

Presenting a very tricky offense and a stubborn defense, Christgau's gridiron performers romped away to a 34-7 victory over Red Lake Falls in the opening game of the season. The Aggies scored two touchdowns in the opening quarter and repeated the performance during the second period. The score at the end of the half was 28-0. Early in the third quarter the Maroon and Gold eleven rushed over another touchdown and with the game well in hand, Coach Christgau inserted his reserves to test their strength.

A beautifully executed 35-yard pass from Kitzrow, Red Lake right-halfback to Fournier, left end, followed by a 22-yard run by the receiver resulted in the only touchdown for Red Lake Falls.

Kenneth Avery, Hallock, left end; Captain Martin Odland, Crookston, right halfback; Robert Larson, Crookston, right guard; Robert Gleason, Minneapolis, quarterback; and Kenneth Flom, Twin Valley, center, were the stars for the Aggies while St. Michael, fullback; McFarland, center and Helm, guard showed up best for Red Lake Falls.



AGGIES, 0—EAST GRAND FORKS, 6

One of the hardest fought grid battles witnessed on the Northwest School campus was played between the Aggies and East Grand Forks in the second game of the 1929 season. The entire game was filled with thrills, the feature being a 40-yard run for touchdown by Carlson, left halfback for the East Grand Forks team.

Early in the second quarter East Grand Forks received the ball on a punt and after two line attempts failed, Carlson skirted the Aggie right end and ran for touchdown. The touchdown was the only score of the game.

During the second half, both teams threatened to score several times but each time the defense braced. The Aggies carried the ball to the thirty-yard line but lost it on downs when their last attempt was short by inches. Hoping for a break, both teams resorted to punting during the last quarter and the game ended with the ball in midfield.

Harvey Johnson, Rollag, fullback and Captain Martin Odland, Crookston, half-back, and Radniecki, Trail, guard, were the big guns in the Aggie attack while Carlson, East Grand Forks, half-back, scintillated for East Grand Forks.
