### Mixed Chorus

The Mixed Chorus, Girls' Glee Club, and Boys' Glee Club are the three major choral groups on the Campus. A large number of interested members was chosen for each organization. The mixed chorus numbered forty-eight, Girls' Glee Club twenty, and Boys' Glee club, twenty-six.

At the first meeting of the Mixed Chorus, the following officers were elected: President, Don McCall; Secretary, Kenneth Avery, and Librarian, John Pearson. Practice was begun immediately for the Parents' Day and Thanksgiving Day programs, at which the chorus sang. After Thanksgiving, work on the Operetta, "Oh, Doctor!" started in earnest, the operetta being presented the last week in January. Other numbers presented by this chorus were sung at the Winter Shows, Baccalaureate Services and the Commencement program.

The Girls' Glee Club has been used to good advantage in furnishing several numbers of splendid entertainment. Besides appearing at Parents' Day program, the girls formed the Priscilla Procession with lighted candles, which was a feature of the Thanksgiving program. Again at the Christmas banquet, they marched in a candle light procession as they sang Christmas Carols. This group also took part in the Operetta, and will finish the year by singing at the Music Recital during Commencement week. Officers of the Girls' Glee Club include: President, Orpha Johnson; Secretary, Helen Carlson, and Librarian, Arlene Hill.

The Boys' Glee Club has also worked diligently under the leadership of the following officers: President, Edwin Widseth; Secretary, Helmer Nornes, and Librarian, Lowell Ryden. They appeared on the Parents' Day program, Thanksgiving program, and presented two numbers in the Operetta which were very entertaining. These were repeated twice during Winter Shows Week. This group will also conclude the year with numbers during Commencement Week.

Besides the singers who learn the technique of chorus singing, there are students who study voice in private lessons. These students learn the correct use of the voice by means of correct breathing, exercising, vocalization and the study of suitable songs in which interpretation is also stressed. They also learn to perform in public because those who have attained a degree of perfection are asked to sing before the student body as well as before other outside organizations who ask for soloists.
