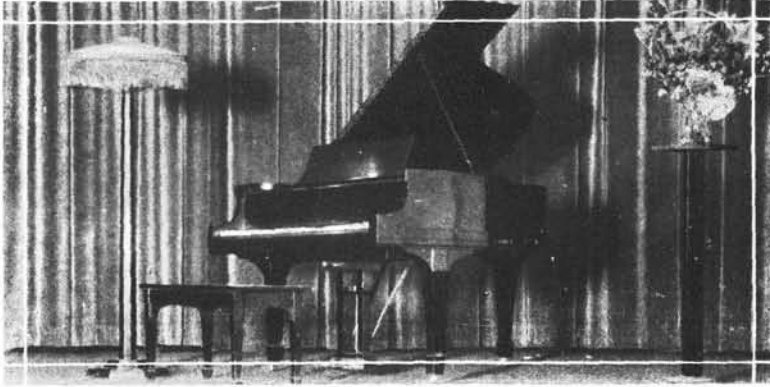




## *Red River Aggie*



### MUSIC
