HOMECOMING GAME

The Northwest School Aggies crashed through to their third consecutive football title in the Minnesota Ag Schools Conference, Saturday, October 29, when they defeated the Morris Aggies by a 13-0 score on the Northwest School gridiron. In spite of an exceedingly slippery field, both teams played excellent football. Forward passes with the Northwest School ends, Stave and Gronner, on the receiving ends brought about the two touchdowns. By virtue of their victory the Northwest School retained possession of "Ossie", a wooden pig, which is the football trophy between the two schools.

Led by their Captain, Ed Widseth, who played a spectacular game throughout, the Christgau-coached eleven clicked perfectly. The first touchdown of the game came late in the first quarter, when after a series of line bucks, a forward pass from Widseth to Stave resulted in the first marker. Captain Widseth plunged over the goal line for the extra point after touchdown. The second marker came early in the third quarter. After an exchange of punts the Northwest team took the ball on their own 37-yard line, and with Captain Widseth, Reese, Risbrudt, Hagen and Greenley carrying the ball, the ball was brought to the 20 yard line where another forward pass hurled by Widseth was taken over the line by Gronner. The Morris team, in this quarter, came closest to scoring when a 50-yard run by Storlie brought the ball down deep in Northwest School territory, but a Morris fumble was recovered by the Northwest School team.

The smooth play of both teams in spite of the muddy condition of the playing field was a surprise to spectators. Only three fumbles were made throughout the game.
