ARTHUR WIDSETH MEMORIAL



Mr. Delmer H. LaVoi, former athletic coach, presented a medal known as the Arthur Widseth Athletic Scholarship Memorial in memory of Arthur Widseth, who was one of the finest and most versatile young men ever in attendance at the Northwest School.

This medal is to be awarded each year to the boy in the Advanced Class who has done outstanding work in athletics, as well as attained a high scholastic average, and who has attended the Northwest School at least three years.

The first student to win this Arthur Widseth Memorial in 1931 was Lawrence Elton.

In 1932 the honor was bestowed upon Kenneth Avery, a young man of outstanding abilities, character, and leadership. Kenneth was captain and one of the most valuable men on the championship football team. His influence on his teammates throughout the year was very great, although he was unable to play in the final game with Morris because of injuries. His presence on the sidelines so inspired the team that Morris received one of her greatest defeats.

Kenneth also showed his great athletic ability as player on the 1932 championship basketball team. He held a regular position as guard, and the opposing teams always found him in most annoying places.

Athletics was not Kenneth's only activity, for he also held a high scholastic average. He did splendidly whatever he attempted.
