The philosophy of education at the Northwest School purposes to develop in the students a personality well-rounded for life. And so we minister to the intellectual man by academic study, to the practical man by vocational training, and to the physical man by athletic exercise. But, "man cannot live by bread alone," or his soul will still hunger and thirst.

And so we minister to the spiritual man by religious exercises under the direction of the Y. M. C. A. and the Y. W. C. A. Sponsored by them, Sunday morning meetings are held for girls in the parlor of Robertson Hall, and for boys in Stephens Hall Assembly. At these meetings, informal discussions and lay sermons are led by

faculty members. Music, under the direction of students, adds to the spiritual warmth of these occasions. Each Sunday night services are held for boys and girls together in the school assembly.
