Livestock Judging

On January 28, the livestock judging contest was held at the Northwest School as a preliminary for the contest to be staged at the Red River Valley Winter Shows and Northwest School Farmers' Week later in the winter. The Advanced class won first, Senior class second, Junior class third and the Freshman class fourth. This was excellent training for the more important contest to be staged later on.

Torliet Boe of the Northwest School was the high man in the contest.

It is to be hoped that the team will be able to win the cup next year, in which case the Northwest School will retain it as a permanent possession.
