

# Stock Judging

The sub-collegiate stock judging contest was inaugurated in 1925 as a feature of the Winter Shows program, and has been held at every show since then. Approximately 250 agricultural school students from Minnesota, South Dakota, North Dakota, and Canada have taken part in this event. The Manitoba Agricultural School of Winnipeg won the first contest, the third and the fifth, and thereby was awarded permanent possession of the first cup provided by the Red River Livestock Breeders Association. A new cup was provided, and awarded permanently to the St. Paul Central Aggies who won their third contest in February, 1933. Our team won in December, 1933, and February, 1935. Northwest School teams have won three contests, Morris has won twice, St. Paul has won three times, Man-

itoba has won three times, and Grand Rapids won their first contest this year. Walsh County Agricultural School of Park River, North Dakota and South Dakota State School of Agriculture at Brookings, South Dakota, have been entered in most of the contests.

The 1936 Northwest School team was composed of Harlan Pester, Glen Tasa, and LeRoy Peterson. In preparation for the contest an inter-class contest was conducted at the school on Monday, January 27, which was won by the Advanced class.

On the day of the contest our team, having won the two years previous, tried hard to secure permanent possession of the cup, but the Grand Rapids Aggies were high scorers, with Morris second, St. Paul third, Park River fourth, and Crookston fifth.
