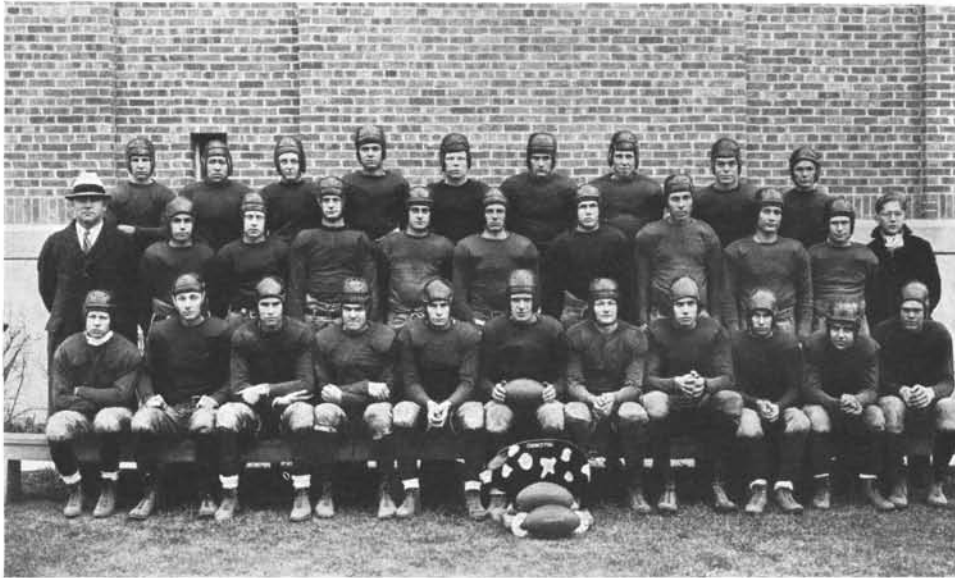


## 1936 Squad

The homecoming game with Grand Rapids on October 26 for the possession of the little brown jug ended 19 to 0 with the North Central Aggies putting over two touchdowns by straight football and one by an intercepted pass. (See page 76 for the play by play description of this game.)

The final game at Morris on November 11 at their homecoming was won by Morris 34 to 0. Their inspired team scored five touchdowns and four extra points while our team was unable to get within scoring distance of their goal. The victory was especially sweet to the West Central students and Alumni as they have been trying to regain possession of Ossie unsuccessfully since 1930, when we first won this trophy which has been the symbol of vic-

tory in football between the two schools since 1929.
