


# Parents' Day

Christgau, with Woodrow Evans presiding as chairman; selections by the Boys' Glee Club and Mixed Chorus under the direction of Miss Katherine Hennig, accompanied by Miss Nelson; a one-act play, "Dress Reversal," directed by Miss Dorothy Smith.

Following the program, the parents inspected the home project exhibits which were on display in the gymnasium. A general get-together of faculty and parents added much to the occasion. At four o'clock refreshments were served, with Miss Retta Bede in charge.

Many of the parents left shortly after lunch, but a number of them remained for the movie in the auditorium in the evening, which brought to a close another happy and eventful day.
