

Stock Judging

The inter-class livestock judging contest was held at the Northwest School on January 18 as a preliminary for the contest to be held at the Red River Valley Winter Shows and Northwest School Farmers' Week in February. The Advanced class won first, Freshmen second, Seniors third, and the Junior class fourth. This contest provided excellent training in preparation for the more important contest to be staged later on.

Five members of the stock judging squad made a trip to Fargo on the Saturday preceding the Winter Shows. Here they spent a day of intensive training at the North Dakota Agricultural College. The same evening Mr. Kiser chose the three members for the stock judging team to represent the Northwest School at the Winter Shows contest. The three members were Leland Hanson, Richard Radway, and Otto Haugen.

In the contest on Monday, February 8, St. Paul won first place, Grand Rapids second, Crookston

third, Morris fourth, Brookings fifth and Park River sixth. Each team entered in this contest were required to judge and give their placings on three rings, of each kind of livestock and give their reasons on one ring of each kind. Otto Haugen proved to be high man on our team with a total of eight hundred and fifty one points with Richard Radway running a close second with eight hundred and thirty one points. In the entire contest Otto Haugen took seventh place, Richard Radway came in eighth, and Leland Hanson finished with thirteenth place.

Clifford Stolan, Ray Carlson, Truman Hemmestvedt and Earl Newhouse were other members of the stock judging squad who deserve honorable mention for the stiff competition they gave the team.
