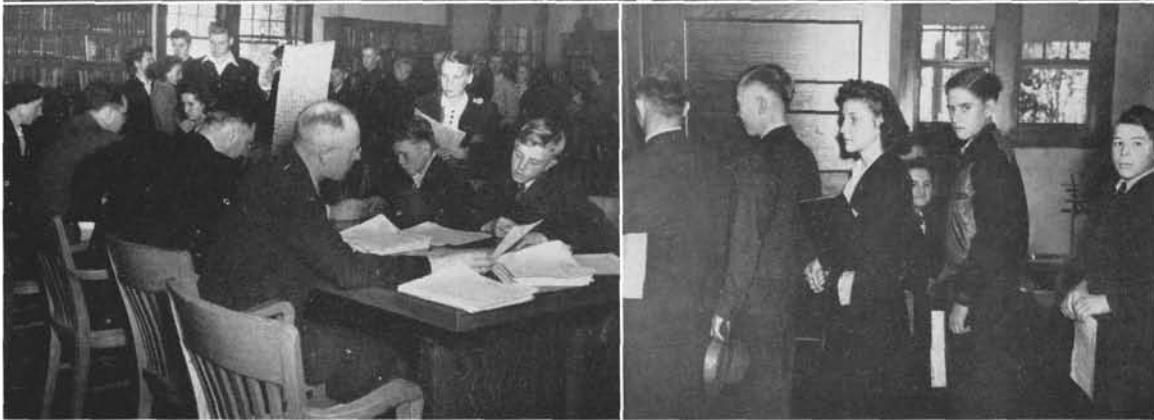
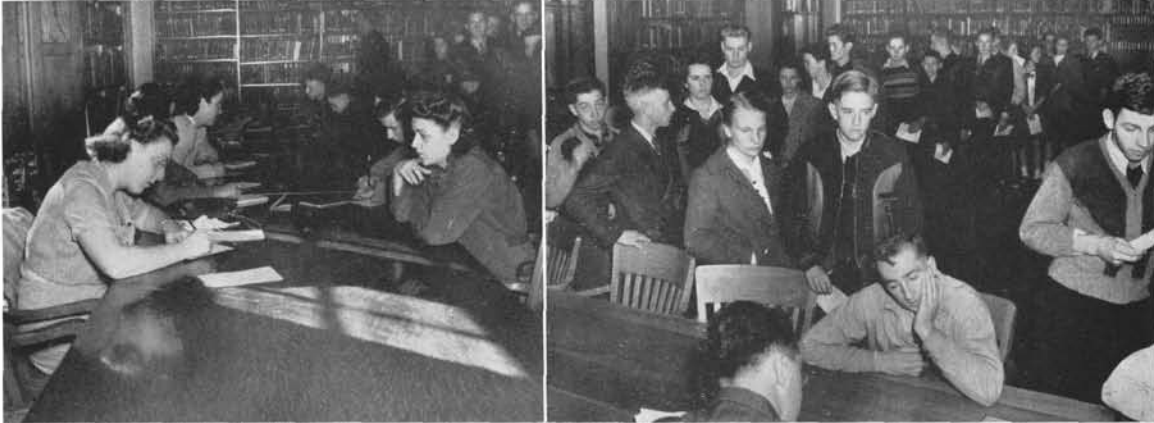


WE REGISTER
