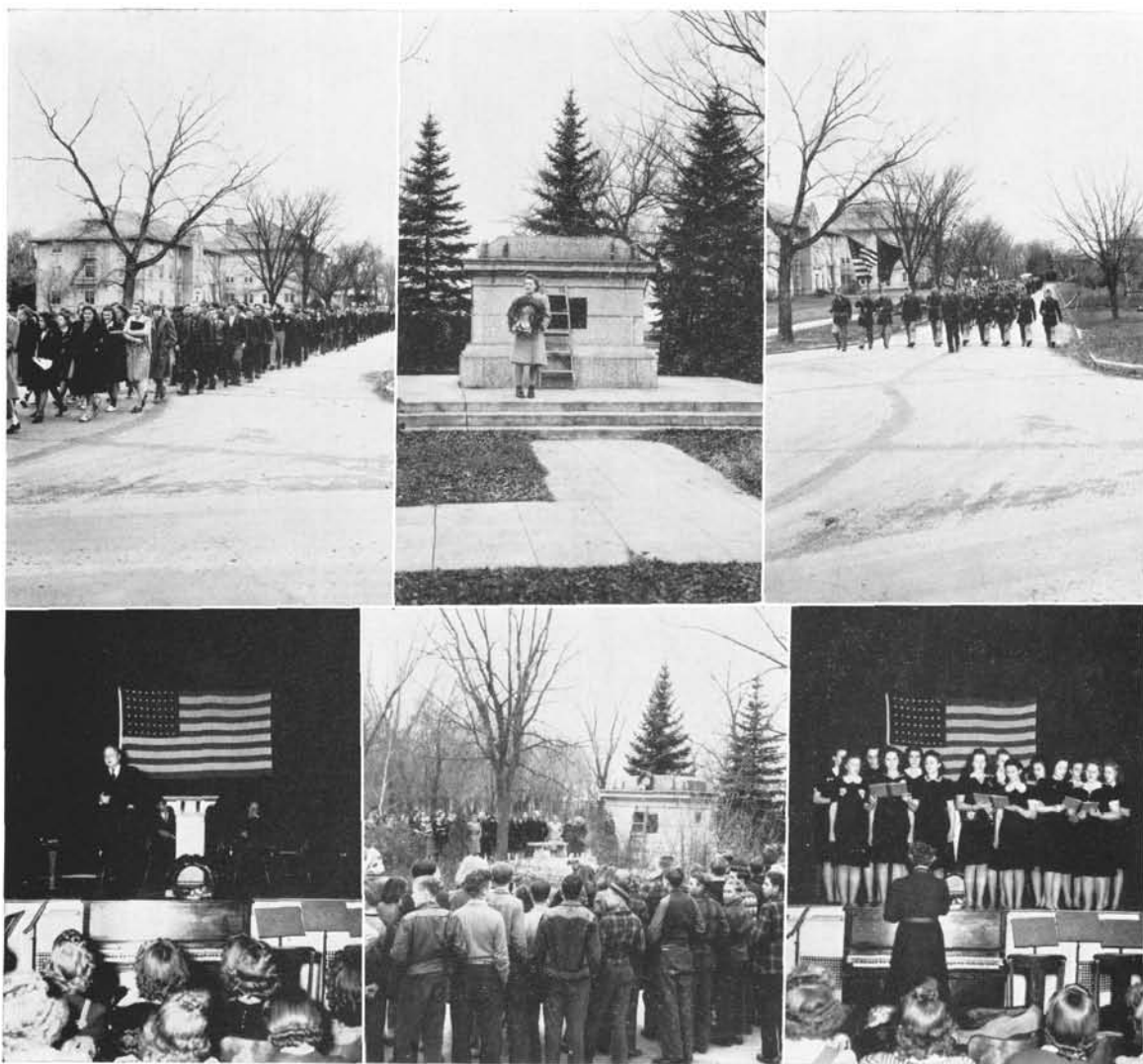


WE OBSERVE ARMISTICE DAY

On November 11 the students and faculty of the Northwest School observed Armistice Day in their traditional manner of having a formal program in the auditorium, followed by a march to the Soldiers' and Sailors' Memorial. The Program included the following: Song "America" by the audience; scripture reading and response by choir and audience; reading, "In Flanders Field", by Helen Rasmussen; "Meaning of Armistice Day to the Northwest School Students," by Supt. McCall; selection, "Sleep Noble Hearts," by girls' chorus; address by the Rev. Willard Reeves; and "The Star Spangled Banner," by the audience.

The march to the monument was headed by the color guard and firing squad and they were followed in order by the president of the senior class, bugler, members of the faculty, advanced, senior, junior, and freshmen classes. Miss Irene Olson, president of the Senior Class, placed the wreath on the monument and paid tribute to the eight former Northwest School students who gave their lives in World War I and the 167 boys who saw service in that conflict. The salute by the firing squad and taps concluded the impressive ceremonies.
