


Left: The Grand Rapids and Crookston Aggies ready to go.

October 7. Aggies Make Good Showing In Opening Game. With only one week's practice the Aggies bowed to Central High School which had previously played three games. Although Central was favored to win, the Aggies, led by Captain Cliff Nybo, gave Central stiff competition. During the first half, the Aggies put up stubborn resistance until the closing 12 seconds when Central completed a pass for a score. With great determination to win, the Aggies retaliated in the second half with Beucler scoring. The fighting Aggies went down to a 14-6 defeat after a hard fought game.

October 14. Aggies Fight Hard But Lose To Bemidji. Still panting from the defeat suffered from Crookston, the Aggies journeyed to Bemidji for their second tilt of the season. The game began with superb line playing of Johnson and Ferrier and with Loyd and

Beucler doing fancy kicking and running in the backfield which almost wilted the highly favored eleven of Bemidji.
