



The Color Guard Leads the March to the Monument

ARMISTICE DAY

The traditional memorial services took on a new meaning this year as the Northwest School solemnly observed its first war-time Armistice Day. The opening program at the school auditorium included the following: The song "America" sung by the audience, "The Meaning of This Armistice Day", a talk by Mr. McCall, selection "On Wings of Song" by Mendelssohn sung by the Girls' Glee Club, and the Armistice Day Address by Reverend Lewis of Crookston. The program closed with the singing of "The Star Spangled Banner" by the entire assembly.

The march to the monument for the placing of the wreath followed the program. The procession was led by color bearers and a firing squad who were followed in order by Robert Phillips, President of the Senior class, faculty, Advanced, Seniors, Juniors and Freshmen. The address at the monument was given by Robert Phillips, who then placed the wreath in memory of the eight boys from the Northwest School who lost their lives in the last war. The services closed with the salute of the firing squad and the sound of taps in the distance.
