HOME COMING

The festivities began Friday night with the traditional torchlight parade led by the band, and the bonfire at which the coach, captain, and various members of the team spoke. This part of the Homecoming ceremonies was brought to a climax when the goat, prepared by the Advanced class, was thrown into the fire. On Saturday morning the Homecoming assembly was held. The band opened the program and played as the Crookston and Morris football teams came into the auditorium. Here they were welcomed by Superintendent McCall. The coaches, as well as various members of the team, made short talks. A clever skit with the setting in a U. S. O. Canteen was given. The football game in the afternoon was a great success, for the Northwest Aggies won the game 46 to 0 from the West Central Aggies, thus winning the conference championship and keeping the trophy "Ossie" safe for another year.
