On the eleventh day of November the faculty and students of the Northwest School had a special assembly at Khiele Auditorium to commemorate this eventful Armistice Day.

At the opening of the program the entire assembly sang "America the Beautiful." This was followed by a short speech by Superintendent McCall who commented upon the contributions of our school to the military forces in both World Wars. A girls' trio sang "The World is Waiting for the Sunrise" by Seitz. We were fortunate in having Commander C. Carlson of the Nels T. Wold Post of the Crookston American Legion to deliver us an inspiring message on the "Meaning of Armistice Day." After singing our national anthem we marched, four abreast to the monument.

The traditional march to the monument to pay our tributes to both the heroes of the first war and those engaged in the present conflict was lead by the color guard. The firing squad, next in line, was followed by the Senior Class President, the faculty, and the Advanced, Senior, Junior, and Freshman classes. Kenneth Price, president of the Senior Class, paid a tribute to the fallen heroes from the Northwest School and then placed the wreath upon the monument in memory of the eight boys from the Northwest School who gave their lives in the first World War and the two former students who so bravely sacrificed their lives in the present world-wide conflict. This act of reverence was followed with the salute of the firing squad, and the sacred sound of taps in the distance.
