From the ten men that went out for crops judging this year, three men and an alternate were selected for the team, which represents the school annually at the Northwest School Gymnasium during Winter Shows Week.

In the three months before the contest the squad members study and learn to identify weed seeds and plants, small grains, diseases, grasses, legumes, and potatoes. They also judge six classes of crops, distinguish the good from the bad, and place them accordingly.
