The 1943 Commencement Exercises were held on March 24 in the Northwest School auditorium. After the invocation, which was pronounced by the Reverend G. J. Heitmann, two selections, "Lord, Bestow on Us Thy Blessing" and "Dear Land of Home," were sung by the choir. The speech choir read chorally "Opportunity," "The Four Little Foxes," and "When Earth's Last Picture Is Painted."

Dr. C. H. Baily, Dean and Director of the Agricultural College and Experiment Station at the University of Minnesota, delivered the address to the graduating classes on the subject, "This Land in Which We Live." Following Dean Bailey's address, awards were given to honor students in scholarship, athletics, music, and dramatics. A total of 114 diplomas and advanced certificates were presented to the graduates by Superintendent T. M. McCall, who presided at the Exercises. The commencement program came to a fitting close as the entire audience rose in singing the school hymn, "Minnesota, Hall To Thee."
