



# Parents' Day

To most of us, Saturday, November 17, was a wonderful day. Mrs. Ecklund was the first parent to arrive, coming in on the morning train. Few parents arrived before ten, but from ten until twelve cars from every direction flocked to the campus.

Lillian Floan of Fertile served as chairman. A report on the Boys' Home Projects was given by Mr. Lysaker. The combined choirs and glee clubs presented "Thanksgiving Hymn" and "Go Down, Moses".

Dr. C. H. Bailey, dean and director of the Minnesota Experiment Stations, spoke on the significance of the work of the Minnesota Stations. Former Superintendent, Dr. A. A. Dowell, reviewed "One Decade of Work at the Northwest School and Experiment Station". Present Superintendent, T. M. McCall, discussed the highlights of the fifty years' work of the Northwest Experiment Station.

A piano solo, "Scarf Dance," was presented by Ruth Norum of Hallock. "Remember When", a one act play, was the final number. The cast of characters was Gladys Auer, Anna Mae Ecklund, Dolores Hamre, Patricia Kurtz, and John Lapp. The program was concluded by singing the national anthem.

Everyone then went to the gymnasium for coffee and doughnuts.

The final event of the day was a feature film, "Tall in the Saddle" at 7:30 in the Auditorium.
