Thirteen lettermen and sixty-five other young men who aspired to football fame answered Coach Lysaker's call at the opening of the 1946 season. A week of pre-school practice really produced results with the Aggies hitting top form early in October which was not in evidence until the last week of this 1945 season. Keen competition for starting positions, too, helped mold together a fast charging eleven, which gained in punch, drive, efficiency and experience with every game.

The Northwest Aggie football team closed its season on November eighth with the Agricultural School Conference Championship and an undefeated season. Games were won from Warroad, Roseau, Fosston, Mahnomen, Crookston and Cathedral High Schools, Park River, North Dakota, and West Central Aggies from Morris. The N. W. Aggies piled up a total of two hundred fifteen points to a total of twenty-four for their opponents.

The climax of the season was a well-earned twenty to eighteen victory over the Morris Aggies, which found the N. W. Aggies waiting until the final fifty seconds to score on a well executed play, a lateral from Younggren to speedster Johnson who sprinted thirty yards for the winning score. The entire squad of seventy-eight, largest in the school's history, should be congratulated for a job well done.
