



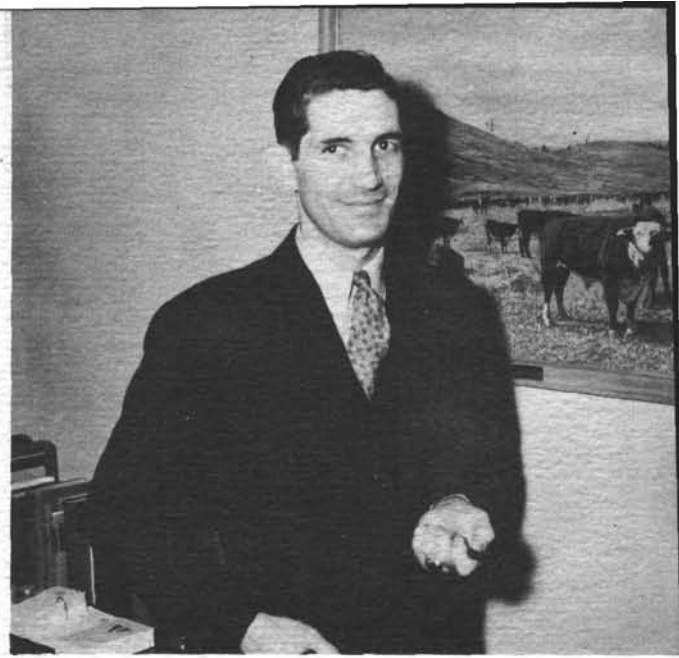
Winnifred Erickson
