From your Superintendent:

An institution of learning and research is no greater than the people who govern it and who administrate it. The University of Minnesota is a land-grant college serving the entire state in many ways.

The Northwest School of Agriculture is a small segment of this great University. This segment has an enviable record of teaching, research, and service in Northwestern Minnesota.

The rapidly changing picture in agriculture and in educational institutions is forcing changes for the Northwest School of Agriculture.

The administration of the University, under the direction of the Board of Regents, is studying these changes carefully. At the present time the general direction of the planning for teaching service points toward education beyond high school.
