

In Dedication for Faithful Service

Arising from a heartfelt sense of appreciation and respect, the 1963 Senior Class of the Northwest School of Agriculture dedicates this annual to Dean Harold Macy. The members of the Senior Class seek to emulate Dean Macy in his capable leadership and his warm understanding of human relationships.

Dr. Macy will retire from the University of Minnesota July 1, 1963, after having been a member of the University of Minnesota staff since 1919 and Dean of the University's Institute of Agriculture since 1953.

A native of Hudson, New York, he was awarded a B.S. Degree by Cornell University in 1917 and a Ph.D. Degree by Iowa State University in 1929. Dean Macy joined the Minnesota staff as an assistant professor in 1919 and progressed in rank over the years to a full professorship, to associate director of the Agricultural Experiment Station, director of the Station, and finally Dean of the Institute of Agriculture. A noted bacteriologist and micro-biologist, he has authored books and many scientific papers.

One of the great contributions of the United States to the educational ideas in the world is the Land Grant College. Dean Macy has provided the highest precept and example among the educational, research, and service activities for the agricultural arm of one of the great Land Grant Colleges of the nation--and, indeed, one of the great universities of the world. Certainly, the citizens of the State of Minnesota enjoy a bet-



ter life for the vision and leadership of Harold Macy. The Senior Class wishes him well as he now enters into another phase of human endeavor, and may we express a sincere "thank you."
