For his personal growth in background, culture, health, and citizenship, the University of Minnesota Technical Institute requires every student to take courses in academic subjects. It is the General Education Division, under the chairmanship of Dr. David Stoppel, that has the responsibility of providing these courses. Of these, Communications is mandatory in all departments. Humanities, literature, and speech may be elected. Science, economics, social studies, psychology, and mathematics provide needed requisites for advanced course work in the

major field. Personal health and physical education are also offered through this division. Since the purpose of the general education program is one of support for the other three divisions, no degree is granted in the academic field.

With the approval of the University a reciprocity arrangement has been made with Corbett College of Crookston to allow students to take and receive credit for academic subjects such as languages which are not in Tech's curriculum.
