The Student Senate, symbol of student government on campus, faced the year with composure and efficiency. Under the leadership of Gerald Moritz for the second year, the group assumed responsibility for campus activities, discussed college problems with state legislators, and sparked interest and discussion into what had been an apathetic student body. The president represented the school at two functions held on the main campus, the inaugural of Pres. Moos and a meeting of student presidents from all campuses of the Greater University.

Because of the imminent national election, politics became a subject for debate on campus, with political clubs active. The entire student body took part in the Choice 68 nominations, choosing Richard Nixon as their favorite. On the national level, however, the nominee was Eugene McCarthy. Forty students took a bus to the University where they heard Nelson Rockefeller talk to collegians from a three-state area.

At a Choice 68 convocation Terry Anderson and Bruce Jacobs gave nominating speeches for their chosen candidates.
