He helps the graduate set up his credentials, teaches him interviewing procedures, and finally sets up interviews. Personnel men from large and small corporations come to the campus to talk to and recruit prospective employees. To help the graduate find out what types of jobs are available, Ebner has on file hundreds of company brochures and other labor market information. Later, if a graduate decides to change jobs, he can have his credentials forwarded to another employer. This placement service, common to many colleges, opens avenues of employment which the student might not discover on his own.
