TEN YEARS OF HIGHLIGHTS AT UMC . . .

1966 Classes opened; 187 freshmen enrolled, 20 of whom were women. Technical Institute dedicated. Pres. O. Meredith Wilson gave address.

1967 HRI Division organized.

1969 Knutson Hall (named in honor of State Supreme Court Justice Oscar R. Knutson) dedicated by Pres. Malcolm Moos on first visit to the campus. Coordinate campus designation - named Technical College.

1970 Ag Division adds internship; Business Division follows. Skyberg Hall, first major construction, named for late Regent Skyberg.

1972 Skyberg, Kiser, and Dowell Halls dedicated. Program for Minority groups begins. KCUM-FM begins broadcasting. Red River Valley Natural History Area opens.

1973 Home and Family Service program approved. Hockey team placed second in nation at Lake Placid. Football team wins state championship. Children's Center opens.

1974 Continuing Education and Community Services Office opens.

1975 Jane Benoit goes to England on first United Kingdom Reciprocal Exchange (UKRE).

1976 First faculty UKRE exchange. Highest increase of UMC women, by percentage, of any U of M campus. NACTA judging teams rank #1 in nation. Original rock-opera by musical director Robert Olson premiered on campus.
