



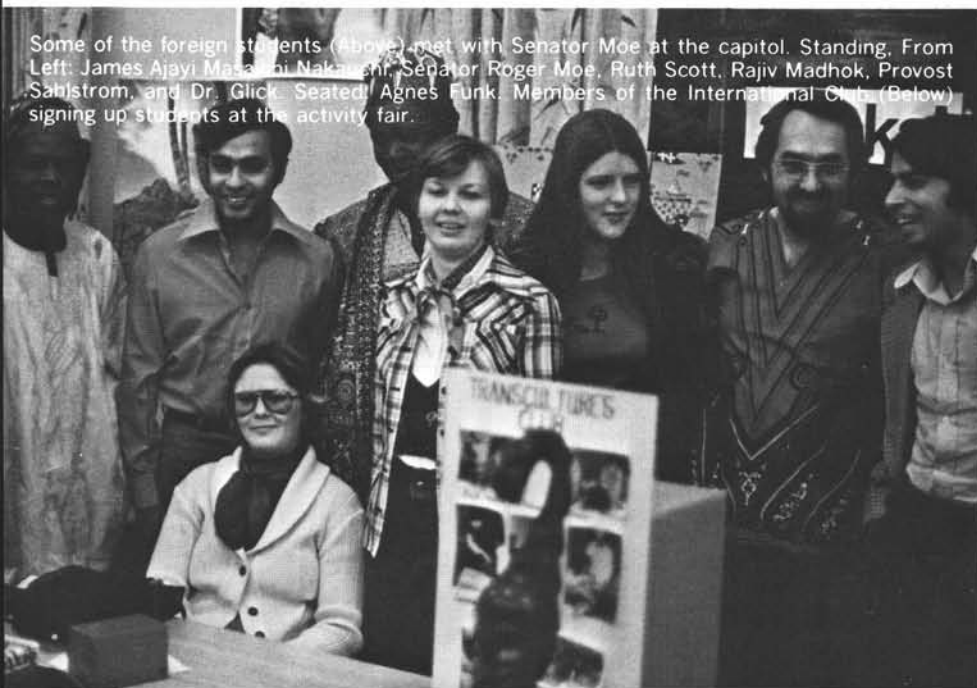
UMC Exchanges Students And Culture
