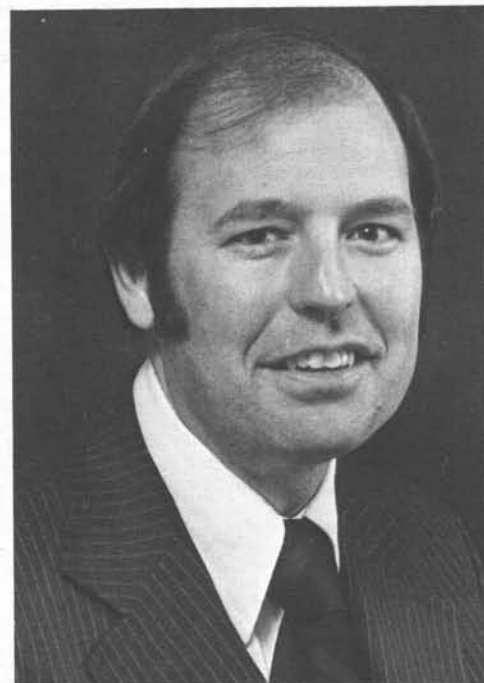
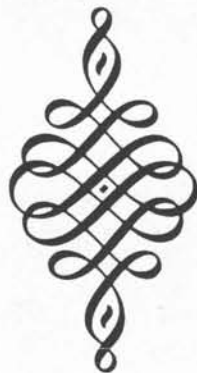


# Provost S.D. Sahlstrom Resigns Don Sargeant Named Chancellor

Stanley D. Sahlstrom, "founding father" of UMC, resigned from the provost position when he was elected to the University of Minnesota Board of Regents in April. He had resigned in October, 1984 effective June 30, 1985, but due to his election to the Board of Regents he resigned early. Sahlstrom was appointed provost in 1965 with the task of changing the Northwest School of Agriculture into a two year college. He was responsible for supervising the development of all new college programs, hiring faculty, and supervising the remodeling and building of facilities for these programs before the doors opened to 187 freshmen in 1966. There were over 1200 students enrolled in 1984-85. Sahlstrom received his B.S. (with distinction), M.S. and Ph D from the University of Minnesota.



**Donald G. Sargeant**

Donald G. Sargeant was named interim provost when Sahlstrom resigned. He was named provost on May 10 for about two hours before the official title for chief executive officers of the coordinate campuses of the University of Minnesota was changed to chancellor. Chancellor Sargeant has been in administration at UMC for the past 15 years. He joined the faculty in 1970 as chairman of the agriculture division. In 1973 he was appointed Assistant Provost of Academic Affairs, a position he held until he was named chancellor. He received his bachelors and masters degrees from the University of Illinois, and his Ph D from Pennsylvania State University.
